The FTSE4Good Index objectively measures the performance of companies that meet globally recognised corporate responsibility standards. UK members are drawn from the FTSE All-Share Index.

A review of index members took place in March after which CWC was confirmed as a continuing member. CWC (and, prior to 2010, Cable and Wireless Plc) has been listed on the FTSE4Good index since its inception in 2001.

Criteria for the index are designed to reflect a broad consensus in what constitutes good Corporate Responsibility practice globally. These include:

- Environmental footprint
- Human and labour rights approach
- Supply chain labour standards
- Commitment to countering bribery
- Commitment to reducing climate change
